A New Church Building - Continued. On December 29, 1969, the church voted to purchase a lot at 32nd Avenue and Beechcrest Drive. This was about five acres of land at a price of \$15,428. In 1970, the old church building was sold for \$24,600 plus sewer assessments of \$3,900 (A sewer project for the city of Hudsonville was in progress at the time). It was sold on a land contract. Ground breaking for the new church took place on June 7, 1970. Mrs. Maude Rynbrandt, the oldest member of the church (age 96), was given the honor of removing the first shovel of dirt. By this time, \$71,000 had been received for the new church building, the architects were Kellogg & Keiffer and the contractor was Quality Builders. During the constrictuion period, church services were held in the Hudsonville High School Auditorium. Sunday school classses were held in various high school classrooms. The Christmas Eve service was held in the First Reformed Church. Various items to be transferred to the new church were stored in people's homes and storage buildings at this time.
